A Note... Membership

Happy Holidays to you and your family. Thank you for making our Women's Club a powerful giving club. It takes all of us working together to make this happen. We are celebrating 60 years of giving back to our community.

As we continue to grow, let's review a few points that our club was founded on and our founding ladies envisioned 60 years ago.

We have had several ladies join our club and then decide that it was too much of a commitment. When you are inviting a lady to join our club, you may want to look over our directory to be aware of the expectations of our club.

Here are a few points to remember:

*Each member is required to participate and/or contribute to each fund raiser, the money raise from these fundraisers goes back to our community.

⇒The **Annual Auction** (November) the requirement is to donate a new item valued at least \$35, if failure to do, a \$50 fine will be issued.

⇒The **Arts and Crafts Show** (the last Saturday in February) requirement is to work 4 hours at the show, failure to do this, a \$50 fine is issued. We are also asked to donate a bake good item for our Bake Sale.

*Dues for Active membership is \$20.

*Members are REQUIRED to attend 6 meetings unless an acceptable excuse is given to the Membership Chairperson, within 15 days of missed meeting.

*The meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month September through May at Rolling Hills Country Club, except January and February, those meetings will be announced.

*Blue Jeans can be worn at our January and February meetings because they are not at Rolling Hills.

* Lunch Reservations are a must if you plan on eating after the meeting, \$20. If you fail to attend that meeting and you made a reservation, you are required to pay for that meal, the club is not responsible for payment of your meal.

* If you only stay for the meeting, you are required to pay a set up fee of \$5.

*Members and guests socialize from 10:30-11:00 a.m. As a common courtesy cell phones are put on silence or turned off during the business meeting and program.

* *Before a new prospective member can join, she must attend at least one General meeting prior to becoming a member. An orientation meeting is also required.*
