Auction Planning

SHOP ON THE WILD SIDE! This year's annual Auction will be Tuesday, November 12 at Rolling Hills Country Club. Doors will open at 9 a.m.

Brunch will include: Breakfast casserole, Vegetarian Breakfast casserole, Italian Pasta Salad; House Salad with Grilled Chicken, Scones, Brownies, Lemon Bars and Cheesecake Bites.

Half pot tickets will be available the day of the auction and at our September and October meetings. Members will be selling them prior to the meetings and during lunch. Tickets are \$2 each or 3 for \$5.

Silent auction opens when the doors open at 9am. Bid sheets will be marked with the item number that matches the offered item. PLEASE BID IN \$5 INCREMENTS. The silent auction will close at 10:30, so you'll still have time to get in your bids during our brunch.

Pre-paid reservations are required. Envelopes will be on the tables at our September and October meetings. Only 150 seats are available, so don't miss your chance at a fun-filled day. If you can't be at our meetings and you want reservations, Please send check to WCN, PO Box 174, Newburgh, IN 47629. Deadline is Nov. 1. Tickets are \$30 each. Invitations will also be on the tables, so please take one and share it with your friends.

All our active members are required to donate an item with a minimum value of \$35. If you don't want to shop, there are some other options. Talk your friends into going together with them on a more expensive gift and let one of them do the shopping. Order your item online and drop it off the day before the auction or give one of the committee members \$50 to shop for you.

SHOP ON THE WILD SIDE is our theme this year for our annual Women's Club of Newburgh Auction, November 12. It doesn't have to be jungle themed, but it does need to be worth at least \$35. Some ideas for you, based on past auctions: purses, earrings, home dec, seasonal items (not just Christmas), themed baskets, chocolate.

All auction items need to be brought to Rolling Hills Country Club on Monday, November 11, from 8-11 a.m. No exceptions. If you aren't able to do that drop off, please make arrangements to drop it at Julie Farmer's house or another member. There must be two index cards with each donated item, to be dropped with your item. Please make your description as fun as you can. Details are important, too. If you're going in with other members, please make sure everybody's name is on the index card, so you all get credit and don't get a fine letter down the road.

NEW RULE: If your item is "some assembly required," please bring your own tools. We will not have those on hand, nor will B. J. be available for assembly. Items must be put together either before you drop them off or you need to do it when you get here. There will be a designated construction zone for such. Large items that require assembly sell better if they can be showcased complete. The ones we had last year were great sellers. Also, try to be on hand to help the buyer take the items apart and back in the box to take home after the auction.
