- 4) For cookies, brownies or cup cakes please bring make **2 dozen** and **package at least 4/package**.
- 5) Do not worry about pricing, the committee will be in charge of pricing and please understand we do the best we can to price for selling.
- 6) Please bring the treats in a box or bag that you do not need back.
