A Reminder...Sweet Shop

It's not too early to start thinking about what you want to bake for the Arts & Crafts Show Sweet Shop. Please remember that Members are required to provide homemade baked goods for the Sweet Shop or pay \$15 to have the committee make something for you. Please have fun with it, get creative, and feel free to make more than required!

- 1) Must be homemade, please do not bring bakery bought goods.
- 2) Must be packaged neatly using our colors: black and hot pink.
- 3) Wrap items so they are visible and label what the items are. It's important to **indicate if items contains nuts**.
- 4) For cookies, brownies or cup cakes please bring make **2 dozen** and **package at least 4**/ **package**.
- 5) Do not worry about pricing, the committee will be in charge of pricing and please understand we do the best we can to price for selling.
- 6) Cakes, pies, puppy chow and anything **zmigze** sells the best. We welcome gluten free and sugar free! Just a few suggestions: Cakes, pies, cookies, bars, brownies, cupcakes, muffins, breads, rice crispy treats, toffee, fudge, cake balls, buckeyes, Cinnamon Rolls, turtles, chocolate gram crackers, Nut bark, peppermint bark, nut clusters, hand pies.
- 7) Please bring the treats in a box or bag that you do not need back.
